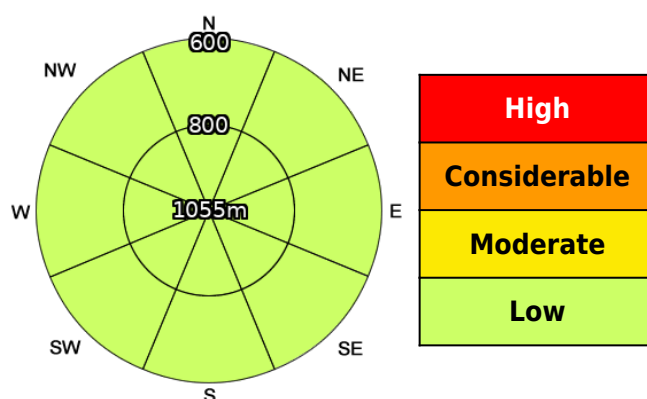


THE AVALANCHE HAZARD WILL BE LOW**Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Saturday 02/04/2016****Avalanche Problems****Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

The snowpack will continue to consolidate, although soft at depth it will generally be well bonded and stable at all levels and on all aspects. Some surface instabilities may be possible on steep slopes affected by solar warming. Greatest accumulations are on North- East to South-East aspects above 800 metres. The avalanche hazard will be Low

**Forecast Weather Influences**

Freezing levels above 1000 metres in the evening lowering to 900 metres by morning, rising to above summit levels around midday. Some light precipitation at the start of the forecast period thereafter a dry day is expected but some rain showers possible at the end of the day. South-South-Westerly winds decreasing in strength becoming light South to South-Easterly.
