

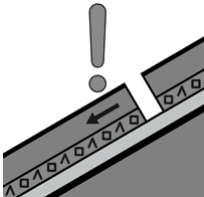

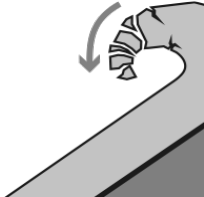
Wind Slab



Persistent Weak Layers



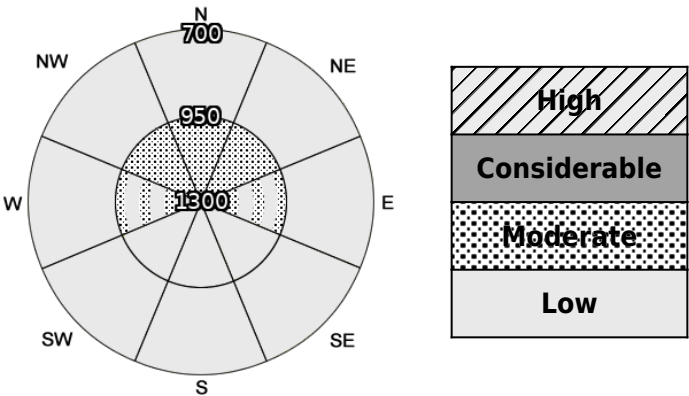

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Localised windslab will develop on North-West to North-East aspects above 950 metres mostly around corrie rims. Old instabilities will persist on these aspects in areas of steep and convex terrain. Isolated pockets of instability will form in other areas due to cross loading. Elsewhere snowpack stability will generally be good apart from wet snow instabilities on some very steep slopes. Remaining cornices will be unstable. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate



Forecast Weather Influences

Throughout the forecast period light showers will fall as snow above 1000 metres. Moderate to strong South-East winds will veer to the South during the afternoon. The freezing level will be just below the highest summits.
