

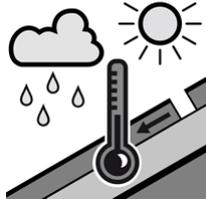

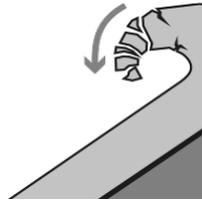

Wind Slab




Wet Snow

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Localised accumulations of windslab will form mostly around corrie rims and gully tops on South-West to North-West aspects above 1000 metres. Instabilities will persist at depth within areas of steep terrain on North-West to North-Easterly aspects above this altitude. Cornices will be unstable and could potentially trigger slopes below. Elsewhere the snowpack will be generally well bonded and stable. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate



Forecast Weather Influences

Dry overnight with a mix of snow and sleet around summit levels through the day. Moderate South-Easterly winds will increase to strong for a spell during the morning and back more towards the East. The freezing level will be above the summits.

Comments

Freezing levels above the summits throughout the forecast period. Cornice collapse and rock fall could be a potential hazard.
