

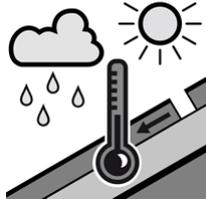



Wind Slab





Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Some consolidation will occur with the old soft snowpack on North-West to East aspects which will be generally stable. However new accumulations of snow will form on East through South to South-Westerly aspects with moderately bonded windslab on steep wind sheltered locations mostly above 1000 metres. Most affected will be corrie rims, ridge crest flanks and gully exits. Glide cracks will continue to develop in deeper accumulations on East aspects. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate



Forecast Weather Influences

Freezing levels will be around 900 metres rising to 1000 metres in the afternoon. Precipitation will be persistent throughout the forecast period falling as snow above 900 metres. Winds will be light to moderate strength Easterly backing Northerly then North-Westerly to West-North-Westerly later.

Comments

A wet day with some snow at summit levels, cooler tomorrow with moderate snow amounts above 900m.
