

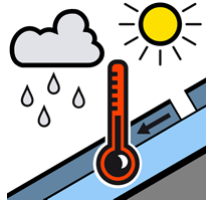

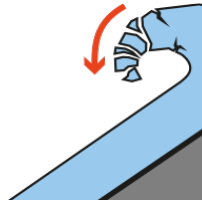

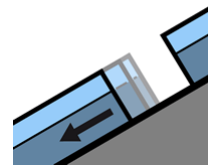
Wind Slab

#### Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

A covering of fresh snow in all locations above 950m. Some surface new snow instability possible mainly on steepest North-East through South to South-West aspects above 950m. Localised instability on steep ground in all other locations above this altitude and some minor wet snow instability below. The exposed old snowpack will remain moist and generally well consolidated. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate

#### Forecast Weather Influences

Overnight snowfall with rain at lower levels. Winds will be light to fresh North Easterly later Northerly then North Westerly. Freezing level oscillating around summits.

#### Comments

Due to complexity of weather systems, low confidence in forecasted snow amounts. Check up to date weather reports and adjust mountain plans accordingly.
