

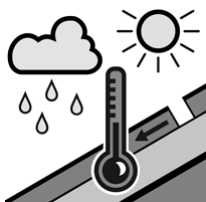

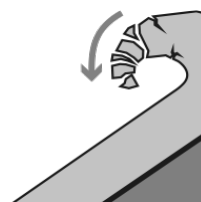

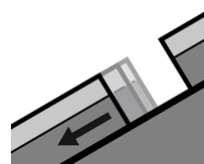
Wind Slab



Wet Snow



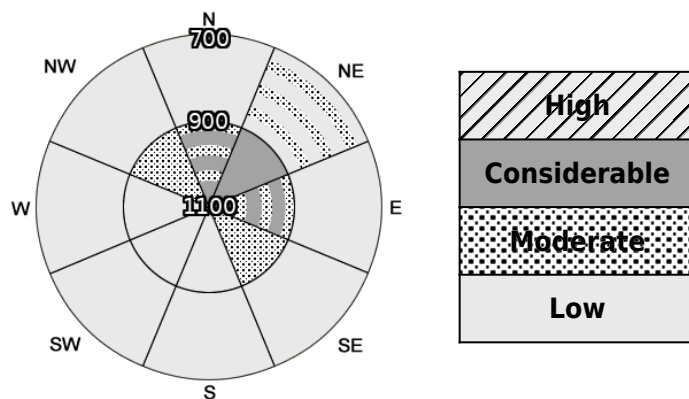

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

New marginally bonded windslab development is expected on steep North to East aspects above 900m. Most affected areas will be gully exits and the top of steep scarp slopes. Minor new weak cornices above steeper lee slopes. The surface of the old exposed snowpack will become firmer or crusty in all locations above 800m. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

Colder with snowfall from the early hours onwards. Winds will be moderate South Westerly later Westerly, increasing in strength as the day progresses.

Comments

Dreich day again on Tuesday with poor visibility. Freezing level projected to fall to 700m during Wednesday.
