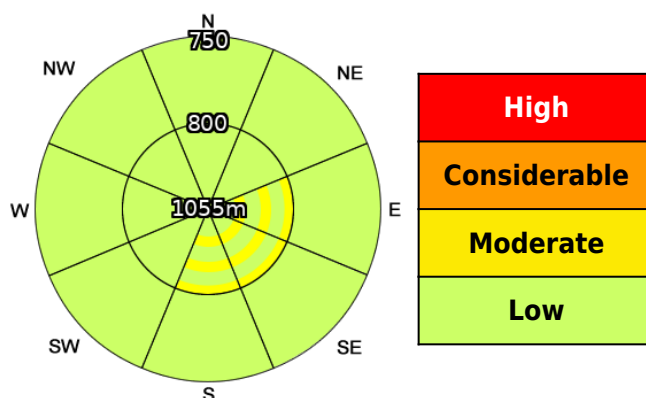

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Localised windslab will develop on East to South aspects above 800 metres. Instabilities will mostly be confined to Easterly aspects where the old snowpack persists with corrie rims, gully tops and crag aprons being most affected. Some surface sloughs and rock fall are possible on steep slopes. Glide cracks on East aspects will continue to widen due to snow creep. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate



Forecast Weather Influences

Winds will be moderate to strong North-Westerly veering Northerly through the afternoon with precipitation falling as snow above 1000 then 800 metres later. Freezing level rising to summit levels during the morning then falling to 800 metres by the end of the day

Comments

Underfoot conditions very soggy off the beaten track.
