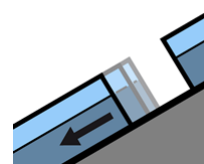

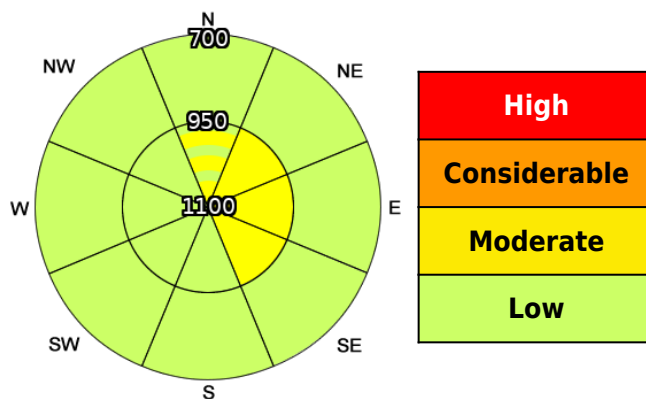

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

New moderately bonded windslab development on steep North-East to South-East aspects above 950m. Most affected areas will be the tops of East facing gully exits and steep scarp slopes. Minor new weak cornices above steeper lee slopes. The surface of the old exposed snowpack will become firmer or crusty in all locations above 900m. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate



Forecast Weather Influences

Snow showers on moderate to strong North West winds. Cold but with a progressive rise in freezing level to around summits.

Comments

Unstable North Westerly airflow makes forecasting snow amounts and location of shower activity difficult. Check up to date weather reports during the day and adjust mountain plans accordingly.
