
Persistent Weak Layers



Wet Snow





Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

After a cold night the moist snowpack will consolidate and stabilise throughout but remain generally soft. Moderate instabilities will persist in the deeper deposits on mainly North-East to Easterly aspects above 1000 metres with steep and convex terrain most affected. Here also, surface instabilities resulting in sloughs due to solar radiation are likely as the day progresses. Glide cracks will continue to develop on East aspects due to snow creep. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate



Forecast Weather Influences

Overnight the freezing level will lower to 500 metres by early morning before rising to 900 metres by the end of the forecast period. Some snow overnight but it will be mainly dry. Northerly winds overnight will be light in the day as the wind backs Southerly by the end of the forecast period.
