Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Light fresh deposits of unstable windslab are possible on North-West to North-East aspects above 850 metres. Existing localised areas of moderately bonded windslab will remain on North-East to South-East aspects. Shallow surface instabilities may occur on steep slopes affected by solar warming. Cornices will remain fragile. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

The fresh Northerly wind will ease and gradually back overnight, becoming Southerly and freshening through the day. The quantity of fresh snow over the period is expected to be small. The freezing level will fall overnight to around 800 metres, then gradually rise through the day.
