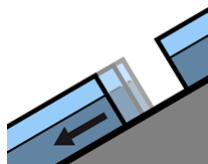

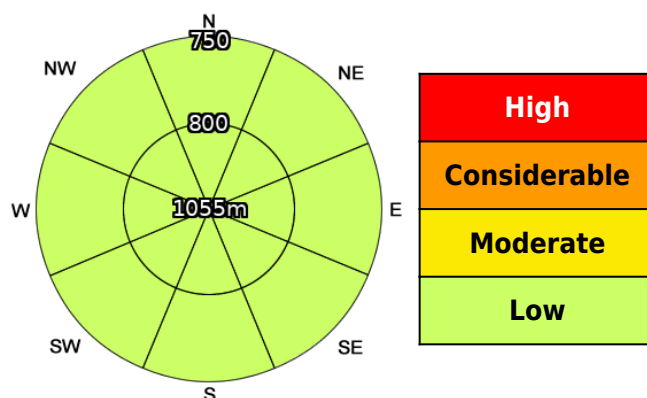
Avalanche Problems



Gliding Snow

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The cooler spell will help to consolidate recent windslab deposits. Any new accumulations on Northerly aspects will be small and generally avoidable. The old snowpack will be well bonded and stable throughout with greatest accumulations remaining on North-East to East aspects above 750 metres. Glide cracks in deeper accumulations on steep East aspects will continue to widen due to snow creep. The avalanche hazard will be Low



Forecast Weather Influences

Overnight moderate Northerly winds will decrease to light and back to the South. During the day winds will increase to moderate and back South-South-Easterly. Mainly dry with a few light snow showers possible above 900 metres through the afternoon. The freezing level will rise from 700 to 900 metres.

Comments

Heavy showers with rising rivers and cascading waterfalls.
