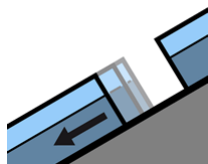
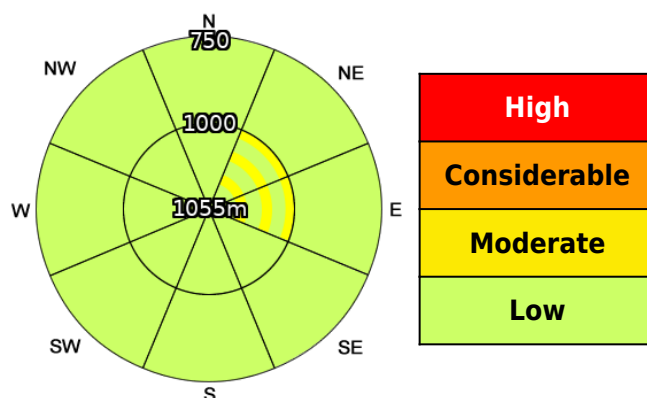


THE AVALANCHE HAZARD WILL BE MODERATE**Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Saturday 09/04/2016****Avalanche Problems****Gliding Snow****Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

Fresh accumulations of snow will lie on most aspects above 400 metres, but mostly on Northerly slopes above 1000 metres where any instabilities will be confined to areas where it overlies the old snowpack on Easterly aspects. Elsewhere although soft, stability will be generally good. Some surface sloughs and rockfall are possible on steep slopes and crags. Glide cracks on East aspects will continue to widen due to snow creep. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate

**Forecast Weather Influences**

Overnight, winds will be strong South-South-Easterly becoming very light Southerly to South-Westerly during the day. Freezing levels will be around 800 metres overnight lowering to 450 metres by morning. Light precipitation overnight falling as sleet and snow, becoming heavier in the early hours falling as snow above 400 metres, drier during the day.
