




Wet Snow

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Any new snow will consolidate where it overlies the old snowpack on Easterly aspects and will be soft but stable elsewhere with any new snow lying thinly on bare ground. Some surface sloughs due to solar radiation on steep slopes and rockfall from crags is possible. Glide cracks on East aspects will continue to widen due to snow creep. The avalanche hazard will be Low



Forecast Weather Influences

Winds will be East to North-Easterly throughout the forecast period, light in strength overnight, increasing slightly with some strong gusts on the tops in the day. Freezing levels will be around the summits throughout the day. Precipitation will be very light occasional showers falling as sleet or snow at summit levels.
