




#### Avalanche Problems





#### Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Little change is expected, the snowpack will be firm and generally stable on all aspects and at all levels. Some snowfall is possible above 900 metres on mainly South-West to North-West aspects but amounts will not be significant. Surface sloughs may occur on steep East facing slopes due to solar radiation as the day progresses. Cornices that overhang many Northerly aspects will be unstable and Glide cracks will continue to widen on steep East aspects. The avalanche hazard will be Low



#### Forecast Weather Influences

Winds will be strong Easterly throughout the forecast period. It will be mainly dry with the possibility of some showers mid afternoon falling as light snow above 900 metres. A cold night freezing level above 600 metres.

#### Comments

Very good snow cover but firm and icy in many places.
