






#### Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The snowpack will remain well bonded and stable in most locations. A few minor surface sluffs are possible on steeper South aspects in the event of sustained sunshine. Firm and well-bonded snow above 900m, moister but well-consolidated snow at lower altitudes. Large cornices over some steeper aspects. The avalanche hazard will be Low



#### Forecast Weather Influences

No precipitation is forecast. Winds will decrease and become very light North Easterly by afternoon. Some uncertainty over freezing levels due to an inversion but temperatures expected to remain cold throughout.

#### Comments

Poor visibility in light showers; clearer later when the cloud base rose to 1000m.
