



Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The old snowpack will remain generally well bonded and stable at all elevations and on all aspects. However instabilities will persist in the deeper deposits on West aspects with additional new windslab forming on South-East to South-West aspects above 900 metres. Most affected will be steep and convex terrain around corrie rims and gully exits. Unstable Cornices overhang many Northerly aspects. Glide cracks will continue to widen on steep East aspects. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate



Forecast Weather Influences

A cold day in prospect with minus 5 degrees centigrade expected at summit levels midday. Winds light North-Easterly at first becoming strong Northerly by early morning. Dry overnight, precipitation falling as heavy snow above 150 metres during the morning, drier in the afternoon.

Old snowpack firm and icy. A cold blast expected friday.
