
Avalanche Problems



Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

New accumulations of windslab will develop on East through South to South-West aspects above 900 metres. Areas most affected will be around corrie rims, gully tops, scarp slopes and crag aprons. More localised windslab will develop on other aspects due to cross loading. Elsewhere the old snowpack will be firm well bonded and stable. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate



Forecast Weather Influences

Dry overnight with light Northerly winds. During the day snow showers are expected above 300 metres on moderate to strong North-West veering Northerly winds. The freezing level will lower to around 500 metres.

Comments

The old snowpack re-frozen and firm. Looking wintry over the next few days.
