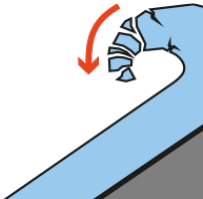

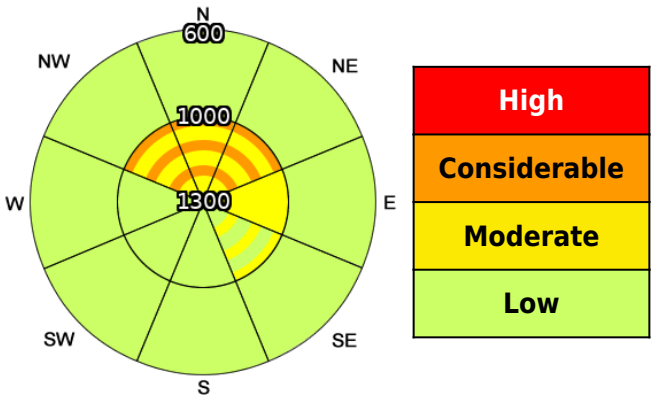

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Initially wet snow instabilities persisting on steep North-West to North-East aspects above 1000 metres. As cooler temperatures arrive the snowpack will begin to consolidate and become more stable. New windslab will develop through the day on North-East to South-East aspects mostly around corrie rims and gully tops above 1000 metres. Cornices will remain unstable. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

Rain at all levels overnight cooler during the day with snow showers above 900 metres. The freezing level will lower to around 1000 metres. Gale to storm force South-South-West winds will veer to the West-South-West and ease but remain strong through the day.

Comments

The next forecast for Northern Cairngorms will be on Friday 6th for Saturday 7th May. The weather outlook is for cooler temperatures early this coming week.
