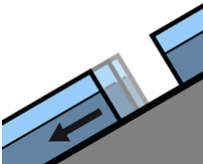

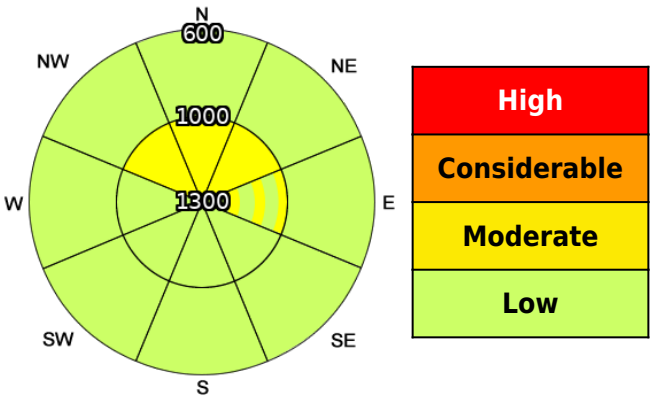

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Wet snow instabilities will be present throughout the forecast period, predominantly on steep North-West to North-East aspects above 1000 metres. The tops of gullies, corrie rims and steep convex terrain will be most affected. Cornices will be prone to collapse. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

It will become increasingly mild throughout the forecast period. The freezing level will initially be around 1700 metres, rising later to above 2000 metres. Winds will be light North Easterly overnight, increasing in strength with gusts to 40 mph by late afternoon. Predominantly dry but cloudy with a chance of a little light drizzle around midday.

Comments

Many ridges are clear of snow. Greatest accumulations are on North West to East facing slopes above 1000 metres. Good ski touring remains.
