

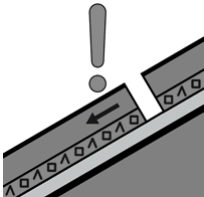

Avalanche Problems



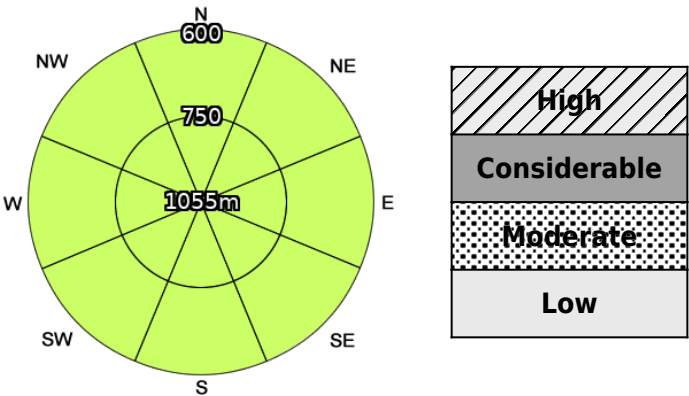
Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

New unstable windslab will form on North through East to South-East aspects mainly above 800 metres. Sheltered hollows, gullies and around coire rims will be particularly affected with cornices developing rapidly. Below this elevation more localised deposits of windslab may also form but accumulations gaining depth are not expected to be extensive. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

Very unsettled conditions becoming colder with the freezing level lowering to around 400 metres. Snow showers overnight mainly above 800 metres at first these will continue during the day falling as snow above 200 metres. The winds will be strong South-Westerly overnight veering West-South-Westerly and increasing to Gale force and possibly stronger.

Comments

Stormy conditions are forecast for the next few days with strong gusty winds.
