
Avalanche Problems



Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The old localised snowpack on mostly North-East to South-Easterly aspects above 900 will re-freeze and become firm and stable. New deposits of fresh windslab will rapidly build on wind sheltered Northerly to South-Easterly aspects above 900 metres, especially where it overlies old hard snow and gains depth. Elsewhere, new snow will lie on bare ground and will be generally stable with localised deeper deposits in steep sheltered places. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate



Forecast Weather Influences

Colder with the freezing level lowering to 350 metres in the early hours. Persistent snowfall, sometimes heavy through the night and morning, to glen levels, lessening in the afternoon. Winds remaining very strong Westerly throughout the forecast period.

Comments

Much depleted snowpack. New snow will fall on mostly bare ground. Remaining stormy and changeable.
