Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Accumulations of moderately bonded windslab will continue to build on mainly North-East to South-Easterly aspects above 900 metres with accumulations in restricted places on wind sheltered slopes with scarp slopes, gully exits and corrie rims most affected. Unstable cornices will also be present above these aspects. At lower levels moderately bonded accumulations will be located in only steep localised wind sheltered places. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate

Forecast Weather Influences

Some light snowfall overnight but it will remain dry for the rest of the forecast period. Winds remaining strong Westerly overnight backing West-South-West then South-Westerly in the afternoon. Freezing levels rising to around 800 metres.
