

Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Wednesday 28/12/2016


Avalanche Problems



Cornices

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

There will remain a generally stable, wet and patchy snowpack, Greatest amounts of snow on steep slopes above 700 metres and mainly on North through East to South-East aspects. A surface windcrust may exist at higher levels. Falling ice and rocks will present a hazard in the mild temperatures and gale force wind. Remaining cornices will be prone to collapse The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

An area of high pressure will maintain a mild airflow throughout the period, with strong to gale force South-South-West winds and the freezing level above the summits. Patchy light rain expected at all levels and cloud around the summits, but brighter in the glens.

Comments

The mild conditions are set to continue over the next few days.
