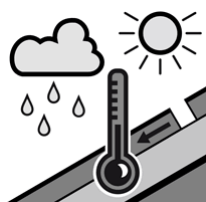
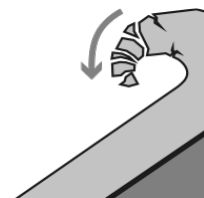
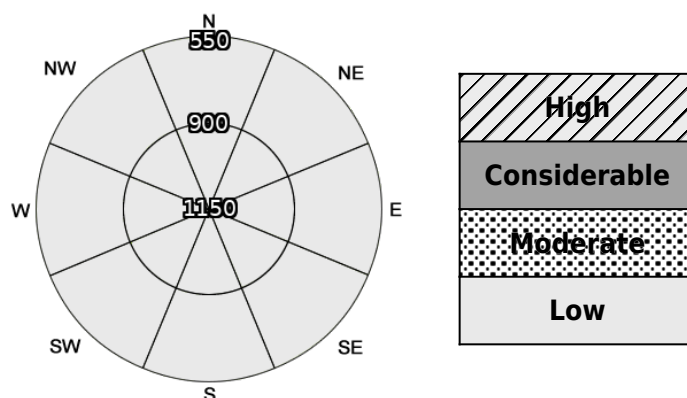


THE AVALANCHE HAZARD WILL BE LOW**Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Friday 30/12/2016****Avalanche Problems****Wet Snow****Cornices****Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

The snowpack will become moist as rain affects the area but stability should generally remain good. However, above 900 metres on North to East aspects some localised wet snow instabilities may materialise on the steepest slopes particularly around corrie rims and gully exits. Cornices will be unstable and prone to collapse. The avalanche hazard will be Low

**Forecast Weather Influences**

Overnight, light rain will fall at all levels, rain will become more persistent during the day with the freezing level remaining above the summits. Winds will be strong to gale force from the South-West.

Comments

The next two days forecast is very wet and mild, turning colder on Saturday afternoon. The winds remaining strong throughout.
