

Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Tuesday 03/01/2017


Avalanche Problems



Persistent Weak Layers

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The snow cover will mostly deplete in the warmer temperatures. Consolidation of the snowpack will take place in the deeper deposits on East to Southerly aspects above 900 metres with some residual moderately stable deposits remaining, but confined to steep wind sheltered locations in gully exits, scarp slopes and corrie rims. Elsewhere stability will be good. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate



Forecast Weather Influences

Winds will be strong Westerly overnight and during the day. Freezing levels will be around 800 metres overnight before rising to 1500 metres early morning, then lowering to summit levels for the rest of the forecast period. Mostly dry with the occasional shower of light rain or sleet at summit levels in the afternoon.
