

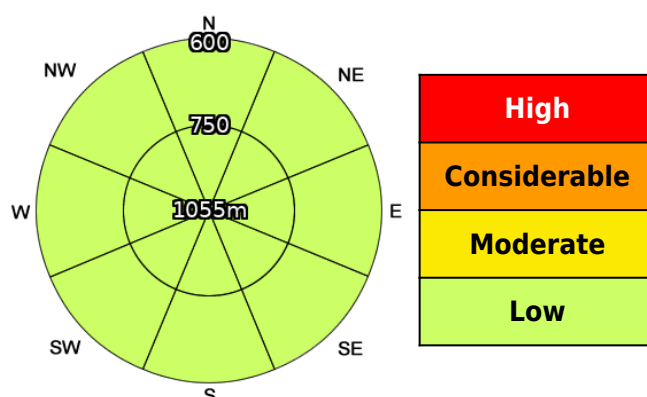

Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Saturday 07/01/2017

Avalanche Problems

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The very limited and stable snowpack will be generally firm with a softer and moist surface. Most snow will be confined to patches and strips around coire rims, tops of gully lines and runnels above 750 metres. Summits, summit ridges and most hillsides will remain bare. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

Little change expected. Remaining mild, except for a colder period overnight, with the freezing level above the summits through the day. Cloudy and perhaps some drizzle on the hills. A light Westerly wind overnight will strengthen and back through the day to a strong South-South-Westerly.

Comments

Typical high pressure drizzle and low cloud on the North West mountains. Remaining mild. Reasonable walking conditions, but do not expect good views!
