

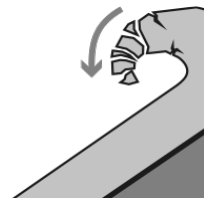

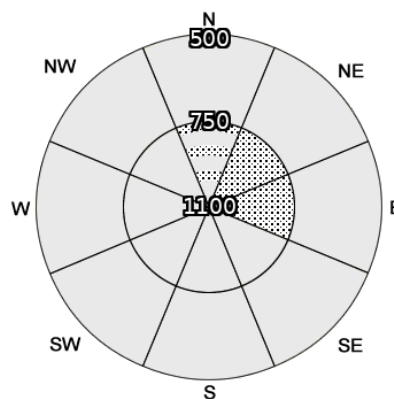
Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

New snow instabilities will begin to develop in steep, sheltered, mainly North-East to Easterly aspects. Where these accumulations achieve depth above 750m moderate to weakly bonded windslab will exist. Any new cornice lines above these aspects will be fragile. Good stability elsewhere of any old re-frozen accumulations and on exposed hillside and ridges. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate



Forecast Weather Influences

Mild overnight before the arrival of storm force South- Westerly winds and a lowering of freezing levels. This will bring snow above 500 - 600 metres. Severe gale to storm force West-South-West winds and further snow showers throughout the day as the freezing level continues to lower well below summits, FL will rise slightly again to 400m at the end of the day
