

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

After a brief thaw the old snowpack will become firm and stable. Poorly bonded windslab will develop on North-East to South-East aspects mostly above 1000 metres. Localised accumulations will form in other areas due to cross loading. Areas especially affected will be steep sheltered areas such as corrie rims and gully tops. On other aspects the ground will be mostly scoured and bare. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

Some light rain overnight as freezing levels rise to 2700 metres. This will turn to snowfall during the middle of the night and continue through the day as freezing levels quickly fall to 400 metres. Winds will be gale to storm force West-North-Westerly to Westerly.
