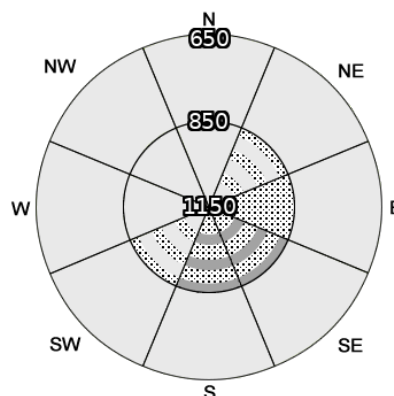
Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Unstable windslab will rapidly form overnight in very sheltered locations on mainly South-East and South aspects above 850 metres with new accumulations starting to form on South-West aspects. Drifting of deposits will continue to occur after the period of snowfall has ceased. Moderately bonded snow will be present on North-East and East aspects above 900 metres. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

Overnight snowfall will ease to give a mainly dry but cloudy day. It will be very cold with the freezing level lowering to 100 metres during daylight hours. Severe gale force North-North-Westerly winds.

Comments

Severe gale force winds in the morning: Easing during the afternoon.
