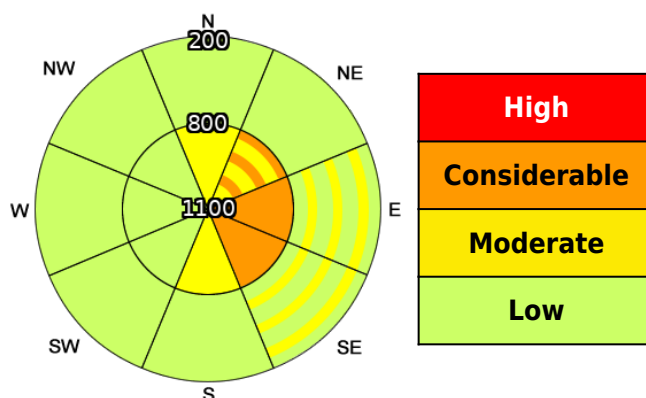

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Weakly to marginally stabilised windslab will be present on all steep North-East through East to South-East aspects above 800m. Recently formed weak cornices will overhang steeper lee slopes. All recently wind exposed locations will remain scoured and well stabilised. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

Remaining cold overnight with snow showers on moderate to strong North-West or Westerly winds. Snow showers dying out during the day and temperatures easing a little.

Comments

Deep snow on most approaches today. 20cm of snow at 270m, 30cm at 400m with much deeper drifts in places. Skis for access a good idea but overall skiing options limited. Access to our area by A86 not easy on Friday.
