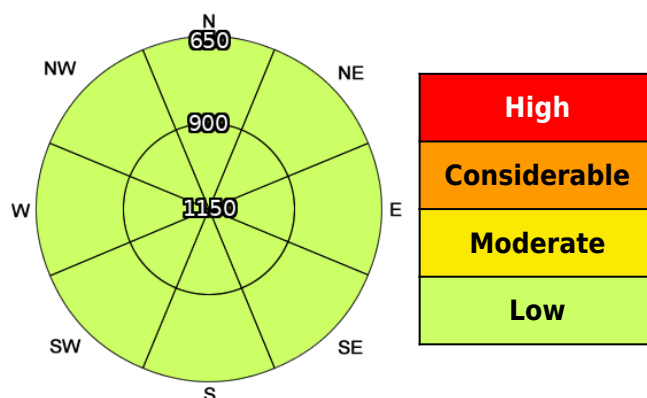


THE AVALANCHE HAZARD WILL BE LOW**Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Tuesday 17/01/2017****Avalanche Problems****Wet Snow****Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

The remaining snow will continue to thaw in the very mild conditions. There will be some surface layer instability on the very steepest of ground but in general the snow will be soft but stable. Rock and ice fall will be a hazard and any cornice remnants will be prone to collapse. Largest areas of snow will be found on North-East through East to South aspects above 900 metres. The avalanche hazard will be Low.

**Forecast Weather Influences**

It will be dry but foggy throughout the period. The freezing level will be well above the summits at around 2600 metres. The fresh winds will veer from the South to North-Westerly by morning and then gradually back to the South-West by the end of the day.
