


**THE AVALANCHE HAZARD WILL BE LOW**

**Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Monday 23/01/2017**

**Avalanche Problems**

**Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

Little change is expected. The very sparse and patchy snowpack will remain firm, well bonded and stable. Most snow patches will exist mainly on East to South aspects above 750 metres. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



**Forecast Weather Influences**

A ridge of high pressure will bring a settled, dry but cloudy day. Light, generally Southerly winds overnight will gradually strengthen through the day to become a fresh South-South-Westerly. The freezing level will rise to around 1000 metres by the end of the period.

**Comments**

Although cloudy, there were also some brighter spells, giving a fine day for a walk. Some water ice and verglas on the footpaths.
