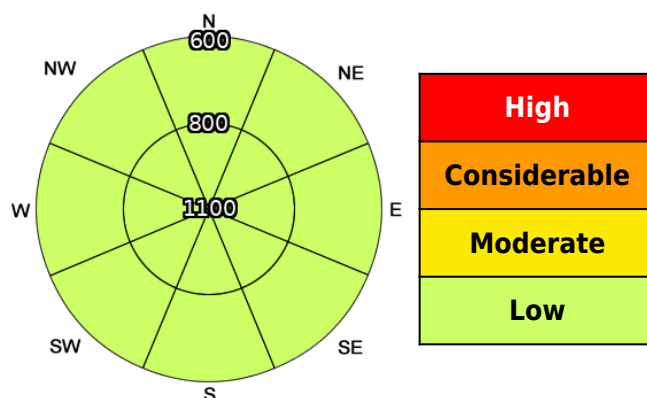
Avalanche Problems



Wet Snow

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The patchy snowpack will remain generally well-bonded in most locations. Steepest expanses of old snow are on North-East through East to South-East aspects above 800m. Residue of some cornices over a few very steep East aspects. The avalanche hazard will be Low



Forecast Weather Influences

It will be an overcast day with some light rain early morning, as the freezing level rises to above summits. Fresh to moderate South-South-Westerly winds.

Comments

The release of full depth avalanche events are difficult to predict; the quantity of any rain early am is not expected to be significant, although with its onset the potential for small full depth avalanches on steep benches and ledges on mostly Easterly aspects exists.
