
Avalanche Problems



Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

There will be a general light covering of fresh snow above 500 metres. Some localised and shallow accumulations of moderately bonded windslab will develop in steep sheltered locations throughout the day and mainly on North to North-East aspects above 700 metres. The remaining patches of old snow will be very firm and well bonded. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

A short period of overnight snow will develop into persistent light snow showers throughout the day, The strong Southerly wind will ease to a moderate South-South-Westerly by daybreak and the freezing level will lower to 550 metres through the day.

Comments

Very little old snow remains and most hills are bare. Fresh snowfall tomorrow, but amounts are expected to be small.
