
Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Initially instabilities will remain on steep North-East to South-East aspects above 900 metres. As the wind increases snow will be redistributed onto Westerly to Northerly aspects above 900 metres. Poorly bonded windslab will build on these aspects especially around corrie rims and gully tops. Windward slopes will eventually become more eroded. Unstable cornices will develop. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

It is expected to be dry with light South-South-Easterly winds strengthening moderate then strong through the day. The freezing level will steadily rise to above summits by the end of the day.
