



Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Tuesday 31/01/2017

Avalanche Problems

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

At first today's traces of fresh snow will thaw and the older isolated patches of snow which are mainly on North to North-East aspects above 700 metres will soften. By tomorrow morning new snow will fall on the higher summits. Small cornices and deeper accumulations of wind transported snow can be expected to build on high wind sheltered North-West to North-East aspects. These new accumulations will generally be on bare ground. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

Strong South-South-East winds will be variable throughout the night veering Southerly and reducing in strength to fresh by tomorrow afternoon. Heavy rain showers are expected and with the inversion conditions these showers will fall as snow on the higher summits by the morning. The freezing level will go well above the summits tonight, lowering to summit levels again by Tuesday morning.

Comments

Fantastic morning in the hills with outstanding views but winds increased in strength by the afternoon making it feel very cold on the tops.
