



Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Thursday 02/02/2017

Avalanche Problems

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Little change is expected. The depleted and gradually moistening snowpack will be very patchy in distribution, mainly of firm and well bonded old snow. Most snow patches will be on North, through East to South-East aspects above 700 metres. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

There will be an increasingly mild and moist South-Easterly airflow, cloudy, with patchy light rain or drizzle at all levels. By daybreak, the freezing level will be well above the summits and the wind will be a strong and gusty generally South-Easterly throughout the day.

Comments

Despite the lack of winter conditions, there is good mountain walking.
