





Persistent Weak Layers

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Small accumulations of windslab may develop at the highest levels on Northerly aspects. With the onset of rain the snowpack will continue to diminish with localised instabilities only affecting areas of steep and convex terrain on North-West to North-Easterly aspects above 950 metres. Elsewhere the ground will be mostly bare with patches of stable snow. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate



Forecast Weather Influences

Light sleet and snow at summit level overnight, turning to rain and drizzle at all levels through the day. Winds will be Strong to gale force South-South-Easterly. The freezing level will rise to well above the summits.

Comments

Mild up until Friday when its expected to turn cooler.
