
Avalanche Problems



Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The old snowpack will continue to consolidate and be generally stable. New accumulations of windslab will develop especially around corrie rims and gully exits on North-West to North-East aspects above 950 metres. Elsewhere the ground will be mostly bare with some patches of old snow. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate



Forecast Weather Influences

Strong to gale force South-South-East winds continuing through the night with rain turning to sleet then eventually snow above 800 metres, this is expected to clear by mid morning. Winds will veer to the South and ease a little through the afternoon. The freezing level will fall to 900 metres.
