



Avalanche Problems

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Through the day, new snow will mostly accumulate in steep sheltered locations, North-West through North to East aspects mainly above 600 metres, but overall, amounts will be small. Other aspects will be bare or have a light covering in localised lee areas. The limited patches of old snow will remain firm and well bonded. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

Light overnight snowfall will increase in intensity through the day, with snow lying above 500 metres by the end of the period. The freezing level will hover around 900 metres overnight, lowering to 600 metres through the day. A strong and gusty generally East wind will ease for a spell midday, strengthening and veering South-West later.

Comments

More sunshine than showers, particularly later in the day, with good sharp views. Noticeably colder in the afternoon.
