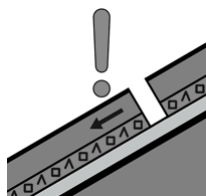
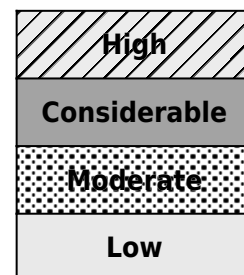
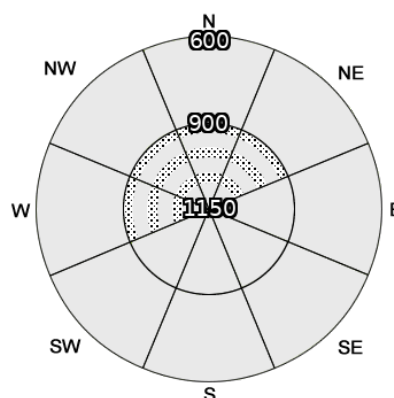


THE AVALANCHE HAZARD WILL BE MODERATE**Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Monday 06/02/2017****Avalanche Problems****Wind Slab****Persistent Weak Layers****Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

No new snowfall but redistribution of the recent deposits will occur as the wind speed increases during the day. Deeper moderately bonded windslab will be present in steeper, sheltered locations on West through North to North-East aspects from 900 metres. Gully exits, corrie rims and similar sheltered features are most likely to be affected. Elsewhere there will be a thin general covering of snow. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.

**Forecast Weather Influences**

No precipitation has been forecast for this period. Light overnight Southerly winds will steadily increase to gale force and back to the South-South-East. The freezing level will fluctuate between 500 and 600 metres.
