

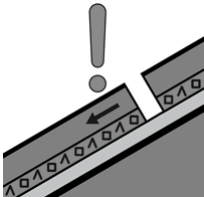

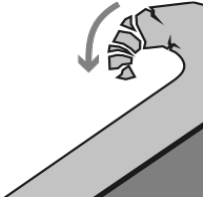
Avalanche Problems



Wind Slab



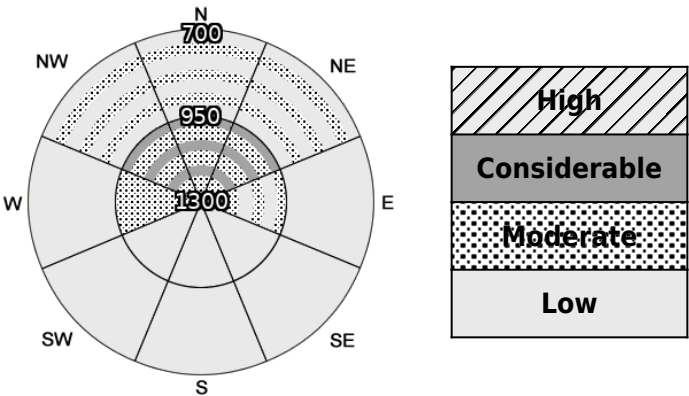
Persistent Weak Layers

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

During the day there will be significant drifting of recent snowfall. Windslab accumulations will become more widespread on North-West to North-East aspects mainly above 950 metres. In areas of steep and convex terrain, around corrie rims, and gully exits the snowpack will be poor to weakly bonded. Cross loading on other aspects. More localised instabilities below 950 metres. Cornices will be unstable. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

It is expected to be dry throughout the forecast period. Overnight, clear with light to moderate Southerly winds. During the day winds will back to the South-South-East and gradually increase strong to gale force. The freezing level will lower to 400 metres.
