

Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Wednesday 08/02/2017


Avalanche Problems



Persistent Weak Layers

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The snow pack will consolidate on most aspects but at higher levels there remains isolated pockets of poorly bonded windslab which will remain unstable. These isolated patches are mainly on high West through North to East aspects above 800 metres. Steep scarp slopes and gully tops are especially affected. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

It will be mainly dry in the West. Fresh North - West winds will be changeable and decrease in strength during the night becoming light South - Easterly variable and increasing to Strong South - East by tomorrow night. The freezing level will gradually lower from around 750 metres to 450 metres.
