

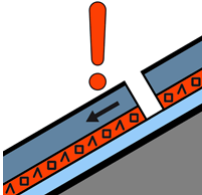

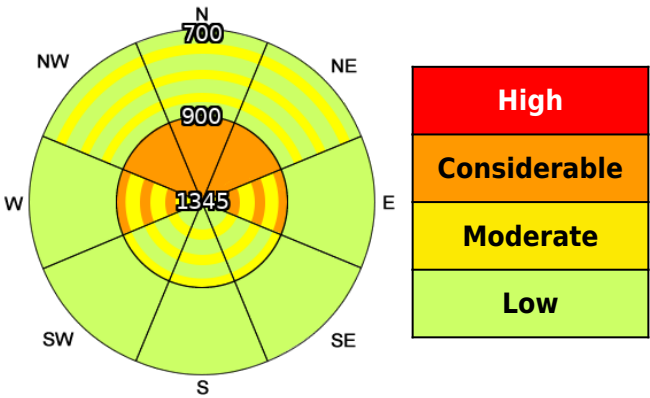
Wind Slab



Persistent Weak Layers

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Areas of unstable windslab will persist with greatest deposits on steep North-West to North-East aspects above 900 metres. Gullies, corrie rims and crag aprons will be most affected. Fragile cornices above these aspects. Localised areas of unstable windslab will also be present on other aspects due to recent variable wind directions. A layer of soft, generally stable snow lying above 500 metres covers and may disguise the windslab. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

Moderate Northerly wind veering South-Easterly. Mainly dry. Freezing level around 700 metres.

Comments

More fresh snow than expected today, covering the unstable windslab layers.
