



Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Accumulations of marginally stabilised windslab will persist on steeper North-West through North to North -East aspects above 900m, as well as the flanks of a few East facing gully exits. Additional drifting of snow is possible as wind speeds increase during the day though instability expected to be limited to locations high on coire backwalls and gully tops. Cornices will overhang steepest lee slopes. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

A little overnight snow will die out to leave a dry day. Light to moderate West North West winds becoming South Easterly and strengthening later. Progressively colder.
