

Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Thursday 09/02/2017


Avalanche Problems



Persistent Weak Layers

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

At higher levels there remains isolated pockets of poorly bonded wind slab. These are mainly on West through North to East aspects above 750 metres. A developing weak layer within the shallow snow pack will persist in the cold temperatures. South-East to South-West aspects are generally scoured and stable although some small areas of instability are present above 750 metres on flanks and ridges where some older cross loaded snow accumulations exist. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

It will remain dry and cold. Moderate South - East winds will back East - South - East by the early morning becoming light in strength. The freezing level will lower from 500 meters to around 100 metres.

Comments

A wonderful day in the mountains, although at higher altitudes a weak layer is developing with in our relatively shallow snow pack.
