

Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Saturday 11/02/2017


Avalanche Problems



Persistent Weak Layers

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The limited, generally firm and well bonded shallow snowpack will continue to consolidate. However, minor weaknesses will persist in isolated pockets of deeper drifts, mainly on North-West through North to East aspects above 800 metres and some West and South-East aspects due to prior cross loading. Gully exits, ridge flanks and crag aprons will be most affected. Other aspects and summit slopes will remain bare. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

High pressure will dominate. It will be a largely dry and sunny day, perhaps with some early cloud. Remaining cold with the freezing level rising from 300 to 500 metres by the end of the period. A light generally Easterly breeze will freshen through the day.
