

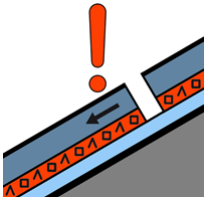

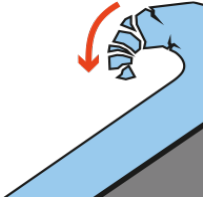

Wind Slab



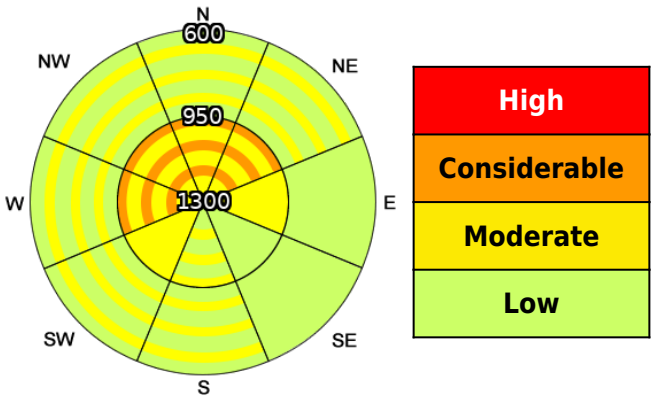
Persistent Weak Layers

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

New windslab accumulations will develop mostly around corrie rims and gully exits on Southerly to Westerly aspects above 900 metres. Northerly aspects will become more eroded; however, instabilities will persist at depth on West to Northerly aspects above 950 metres mostly within steep and convex shaped areas, corrie rims, gully exits and crag aprons. Cornices will be unstable. At lower levels localised instabilities will remain on some steep banks. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

A dry night with light to moderate East-North-East winds. Some snowfall expected during the day on moderate to strong North-East winds. The freezing level will rise from 300 to 500 metres.

Comments

Redistribution of snow expected mostly during the daytime.
