



Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Windslab will become more extensive on South-Westerly to North-Westerly aspects above 900 metres with cross loading affecting other areas. On these aspects the snowpack will be moderate to poorly bonded where deeper deposits form in steep terrain. Weaknesses will persist at depth on West to Northerly aspects above 950 metres mostly within steep and convex areas, corrie rims, gully exits and crag aprons. Cornices will be unstable. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

Light snowfall mostly during the first part of the evening and during the afternoon. Winds will be moderate to strong Easterly. The freezing level will be between 400 and 500 metres.
