



**Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Monday 13/02/2017**

**Avalanche Problems**

**Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

The snow cover will remain shallow and sparse in most locations with the main snowline around 550 metres. The snowpack gains depth and extent in localised areas, mainly gully exits, ridge flanks and coire rims above 700 metres, North-West through North to East aspects, where it will continue to consolidate. Other aspects and some summits will remain bare. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



**Forecast Weather Influences**

It will be dry and bright with some broken cloud at times. Gradually warming through the period with the freezing level rising above the summits by early afternoon. The strong Easterly wind will moderate through the day.

**Comments**

It will continue to feel cold despite a gradual warming tomorrow.
